Magdalenian, Isturitz Site, France Probably .MAMMOTH -1- represents summer mammoths MAMMOTH -2- the southward early winter migration during which an annual mammoth hunt takes place and the northward spring vacation, as polar easterly winds switch to west winds, the earth warms, rains fall, and the vast long-grass cold prairie extending through Europe, across Asia, on across Beringia, and on into North America's great central plains suddenly grow.

[TRANSLATION] This is a contract between a lady and her helpers who stay in a village with a hunter who regularly supplies them with food; and annually supplies them with hides, hair, wool, down and other commodities. Ladies, wives, and daughters toil to make clothes, comfortable homes, and care for children. Always paced by a seasonal cycle or glacial winters "iron frosts;" migrations of people, animals and periodic "state fair-like" trader's rendezvous. These compare with, but are more than the fall rendezvous America's mountain men held in the Rocky Mountains.




Most of what's written in and about the shoe-part; which is the most difficult work. It's also the most important in the bitterly cold glacial winter. It must be both durable and protect against temperatures that can range fifty below freezing and more.



[FORMAT]. A weaver describes unusual animal products. Lower right is probably a WOLVERINE, one of the few animals with fur that will not collect frost from exhaled breath. A century ago is was widely used in fringes about winter coat's hoods. Right: a statuette of a hooded person [early- or pre-Bølling] from BEDEILHAC, France would ideally have a furry wolverine fringe about his face.

Lions, Cougars, Seals and a few other animals have areas of very coarse, tough, water-resistant whisker-like [bristle-like] hair. Such hairs, made into pads with glue, make splendid inner soles for shoes, boots and moccasins. They not only retain little water; but let sweaty moisture-lades air pass through and out; and also quickly allow water entering the footware to drain-out. And even soaking-wet they retain warmth.

Heat retention by such fabrics of ca.12,500 BC, compare with ca.1,000 BC to late 1800's AD Scots sleeping in special plain weaves which would keep one warm to sleep outdoors during drizzles amidst damp snows; and more recently scuba divers wet suits which are reasonable comfortable in near freezing waters.



Left: from Le Placard Site, Provenance, France, Magdalenian IV ca 12,500 BC, a battan carved of bone. Flattened, spatula-like, to slip between the vertical WARP strands; with the pointed ear at top curved so it can be turned side-to-side when separating the vertical threads in order to weave-in the horizontal WOOF strands. Woven-in, the woof strands are pressed-down to tighten the weave---- "battened down." [note: Weaver's terminology latter applied to ships as in "battendown the hatches a storm comes."] [On the batten instructions are engraved, and preferred fibers for Warp, Woof, and patterns.]


